## *The Rhodo Ravine Project Update*

The restoration and rehabilitation of the Rhododendron Ravine continues to be the principal focus of the Friends of Dominion Brook Park Society. We are well into Phase 2, the planning phase of the project, and we will now move forward with completing the topographic and geotechnical requirements. In the coming year, as funding permits, we hope to begin the detailed planning portion of Phase 2. Once complete, we will be in a position to establish a budget for Phase 3 and to solicit assistance from local contractors.

There are further requirements in Phase 2, including the obligation for additional Environmental Study for the CFIA, and the necessary permits. These conditions will be met just prior to commencing Phase 3 so that we will be in compliance with the most current regulations.

Although there appears to be little evidence of restoration or rehabilitation we are continuing to move ahead with our plan to return the Ravine to its former glory at the heart of Dominion Brook Park.

## *Featured Plant*

### *Rhododendron basilicum*



**A handsome large leaved small tree with creamy white flowers with a distinctive crimson blotch in a truss of 10-25 flowers. Flowering between March to May with attractive young foliage and shiny dark green leaves up to 36cm long with a fawn woolly indumentum on the underside. It grows 3-12 meters and best in a sheltered woodland.**

**A native to Western Yunnan and Northeast Burma and was introduced to the west in 1913. Our specimen was donated by park goer and rhodo propagator par excellence, Don Whittle.**
